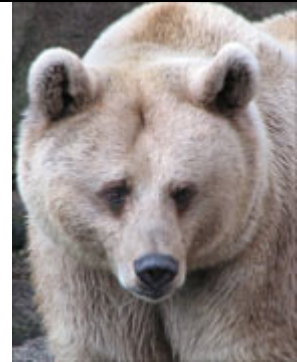


What If I Lost My Home?

Type of task

Problem solving, imagining and drawing.

Age group for this activity

This What If I Lost My Home Activity is designed for Year/grade 1 - 6 students (age 6 - 12).

Homes and habitats

A habitat is an animal's home. It's where they have what they need to survive, including food, water, shelter and somewhere to raise their young.

Many animal habitats are being lost.

A lot of animals are threatened with extinction because if they lose their home, they can't adapt and survive.

If a species of animal becomes extinct we will never see these animals again.



Activity instructions

Children can be asked to:

1. Read the information about endangered animals on Planet OzKids at:

2. Close your eyes for a minute. Imagine that your home has been torn down.
 - What can you see?
 - What do you have left?
3. Think about how you would survive.
4. Think about these questions:
 - Where would you sleep?
 - What would you eat?
 - How would you keep clean?
 - How would you keep warm?
 - How would you avoid sunburn?
4. Draw a picture of what you might look like one year after losing your home.



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
